

## Jaguar Trails

The National Wildlife Refuge Mixed Caño Negro is constantly visited by large felines as part of the distant routes they carry out in search of food, shelter and reproduction, crossing the forests to head towards the central mountain range or to the wooded plains of The Caribbean coast.

Due to the presence of people with domestic animals within the protected area, jaguars roam in the vicinity of some properties in search of potential prey such as calves, dogs, pigs and sheep, which results in some records of the presence of these powerful animals leaving footprints, excrement and corpses.

Let us know the natural habitats of the most powerful felines in the world and live the experience of traveling through the same areas that they use in their journey, without leaving aside the feeling of the people who normally coexist with the presence of these animals.
